<u>Highland Park Soccer Academy:</u> Roles and Responsibilities <u>Director of</u>

Coaching

Within the framework of the Highland Park Soccer Academy the Director of Coaching (DOC) must meet the follow criteria to effectively build the Academy in a positive, effective, and efficient manner:

Coaching Education:

- The DOC is responsible for creating a collaboration of all coaches within the club and addressing club concerns in a proactive manner. This includes, but is not limited to:
 - Two coaches' in-service days with all coaches (1 per season)
 - Develops and maintains an HPSA "coaches manual" that includes the Academy curriculum, coaches' best practices, and any additional tips that the DOC feels if relevant to his/her coaching staff. DOC's ongoing routine should include regular coach-DOC meetings to make sure HPSA team expectations are being met (i.e. coaching staff is directed by the DOC to submit rosters to HPSA Admin by a deadline and does so accordingly; DOC ensures all coaching expectations, policies, and rules are clear to the staff; DOC ensures coaching staff is communicating with their team parents, and so on).
- Game evaluation (with written evaluation to coach and cc'd to HPSA Leadership Team) of teams and/or coaches with scheduled follow-up meetings with the coaches on a regular basis to discuss the team and development needs of the players, at least 2 per season.
- Work with teams, when the coach and/or DOC feels is necessary, to help with the development of all club teams and players
- Helping coaches with training and developmental session plans in accordance with the Academy Curriculum
- Organize seasonal testing dates for all teams i.e. fitness tests and/or skills tests (U11 should be able to juggle at least 15 consecutive times...are U11 team players demonstrating this ability? If not, DOC works more hands-on with the coach to make sure players are where they need to be).

Community & Parental Relations:

- Attendance at all YMCA Parent Coach—Player clinics as set up by the academy in conjunction with the Moody YMCA. Admin will set this up with YMCA for a time that works on both ends – the DOC & the YMCA.
- Meet with parents on a scheduled basis to discuss personal development plans for teams and/or players.
- Organize and instruct parental meetings that discuss the tactical and technical developmental plan for teams in support of the team coach
- All soccer related issues will be run through the DOC

Team/Player Organization:

- The formation of teams through recruitment of parent managers in the local community
- Hiring of qualified coaches for each team
- Education of the "new" parent managers and parents
- Evaluation of teams and determination of which competition level is appropriate to

- assure the appropriate development and success
- Ensuring team coaches have provided a player evaluation at the close of every season (2 per year)
